# Highlights from Super Thursday

#### **SCOTLAND**

The SNP returned to power but just fell short of the 65 seats that would have given them a majority. Indeed, the performance of Nicola Sturgeon's party was to a large extent overshadowed by the Conservatives under Ruth Davidson – no one's idea of a traditional Tory – who celebrated becoming leader of the country's official opposition with a punchy exchange of views with Sturgeon over the prospects of another independence referendum.

#### **WALES**

Although Plaid Cymru leader Leanne Wood ousted Labour Leighton Andrews from the Rhondda seat in the Welsh election's most sensational result, Labour ended just one seat down and will lead with a minority. UKIP gained their first ever representation in Wales, winning seven of 60 seats – one of them going to Neil Hamilton...

#### **NORTHERN IRELAND**

Negotiations over a programme for government in Northern Ireland are now not expected until later this week, with 29 of the 108 MLAs new to the assembly and the customary patchwork of representation behind the two largest parties, the DUP and Sinn Féin. According to Amnesty International,

at least 58 of the 108 elected Assembly members (MLAs) support the introduction of equal marriage – a marked shift, after the last assembly had repeatedly failed to introduce legislation to bring Northern Ireland into line with the rest of the UK.

#### **MAYORAL ELECTIONS**

While Sadiq Khan's resounding victory in London provided some solace for Labour and even more for those attuned to the dogwhistle of his opponent's campaign, it was far from the only mayoral triumph for diversity in Britain. Salford's new mayor Paul Dennett overcame a violent upbringing and conflicts over his sexuality on his way to becoming one of the north-west's most powerful politicians, while in Bristol Marvin Rees became the first directly elected mayor of African/Caribbean descent in the whole of Europe.

### POLICE COMMISSIONER ELECTIONS


One set of elections where diversity didn't win through, despite their original remit. An increased turnout from the levels of 2012 appears to have been a direct result of piggybacking on other local elections, with lower turnouts in areas where no other contests were taking place – another consequence may well have been a more party political vote. Just a third of independent candidates held on to their jobs by the time the final votes were counted.


